In the State of Alabama, Mobile County remains to be the most at-risk county in the state in which to contract HIV, and has had the highest number of new incidence in Alabama since 2015.



AIDS Alabama South (AALS) is currently the only AIDS service organization between New Orleans, LA and Pensacola, FL and north to Montgomery, AL. AALS covers 12 counties and 12,545 square miles of Southwest AL, offering a continuum of support services to the HIV/AIDS community. We provide essential life-sustaining services to individuals living with HIV/AIDS, quality age-appropriate prevention education programs, free confidential HIV and Hepatitis C testing, consumer advocacy trainings and support groups for all races, ethnicities, genders, ages and sexual identities.

Newly diagnosed individuals are assisted with accessing the medical care needed to maintain their health and wellbeing. Individuals receive education about the virus, current medicines and treatment. They are given social support and referral information designed to meet their needs and reduce barriers that may prevent them from addressing their HIV status.
